Based at Mississippi State University, the Mississippi Migrant Education Service Center (MMESC) is an education program for seasonal and temporary agricultural workers and families.

What Do We Offer?

The MMESC supports migrant youth and children through providing free educational services to those eligible for the program.

Services are tailored to individualized needs and include:

- English classes
- Skills training (bilingual)
- Hygiene kits and facemasks
- COVID-19 safety lessons
- GED/ACT preparation
- Tutoring programs
- School supplies
- Assistance with school registration
- Referrals to health and community resources
- Parent classes
- Enrichment activities
